Nate Groelsema | Elder



My walk with Christ began in my childhood home. My mom and dad, Robbie and Grady Musgrove, were both Christians, and they raised me and my older sister, Casondra, in the faith. We also lived next door to my paternal grandmother, Elvena Musgrove, who was a prayer warrior and had deep faith in the simplicity of the gospel. It took years, however, before I really acquiesced to Jesus being Lord of my life.
